

Updates on Our Recently Featured 4-H Stories

YOU RECENTLY HEARD FROM MARY who wrote about her experiences in Kenya and how 4-H has played an important role in shaping her new life in America. Mary continues to be involved in teaching science to young people and believes passionately in being of service to others and contributing to her community:

“The biggest surprise for me about 4-H was how many people come back every year to make a difference in someone’s life, be interactive with other people, and have fun. I have made connections in 4-H that will help me in my future plans. **Through 4-H, I have been able to find out more about college and I have recently learned that I have been accepted to Sacramento State University!** My long term goal is to further my education in order to be a pediatrician.”

A 4-H Study of Positive Youth Development* discovered young people involved in 4-H report better grades, are more likely to plan to go to college, and are more inclined to pursue courses or a career in science, engineering, or computer technology. The study found that girls in 4-H are **1.6 times more likely** to pursue science careers over their peers. 4-H youth are **3.3 times more likely** to be engaged in their communities.

* Dr. Richard Lerner, and a team at the Institute for Applied Research in Youth Development at Tufts University have been working with faculty at land-grant universities to conduct The 4-H Study of Positive Youth Development beginning in 2002. The 4-H Study of Positive Youth Development study is surveying more than 7,000 adolescents from diverse backgrounds across 44 U.S. states (<http://www.4-h.org/about/youth-development-research/positive-youth-development-study/>).

IN 2013 THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA 4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM will be celebrating its 100th anniversary. We will honor 100 years of community impacts by highlighting the powerful ways that 4-H youth are taking leadership roles in their local communities today through an initiative called the **Revolution of Responsibility**.

The **Revolution of Responsibility** is a state-wide effort that builds on the service learning component that is core to all 4-H programs. This takes the form of youth-designed, youth-led projects where participants identify an issue in their community, and design and implement a project to address that community issue. In 4-H youth learn leadership by leading, collaboration by collaborating and civic engagement by actively seeking opportunities to make a difference in their communities. There is no greater force for positive change than youth learning and taking action. It has been the legacy of 4-H for 100 years. The **Revolution of Responsibility** will celebrate the power and value 4-H creates in California by supporting 1,000 service-learning projects through our centennial year and beyond.

The California 4-H Foundation is committed to raising and distributing up to \$1,000 for each project to support their implementation. We are inviting our individual, corporate and foundation donors, our alumni and community partners to join the **Revolution of Responsibility** by supporting this endeavor and celebrating 100 years of 4-H.

My name is Chance Boreczky, and I'm 14 years old. This year, 4-H has enabled me to make a significant change in my community. For the past four years, I've been a member of an Environmental Stewardship Project fondly called Plastic Eliminators. We've been educating the public about environmental issues caused by plastics. We have manned educational booths at events, composed an award winning video, *A Plastic Predicament*, and performed an original skit to educate school children about plastic pollution. Since the beginning of the project, we've also attended many of our city's council meetings to convince them to ban various types of harmful plastic. They've certainly been listening to us.

We recently heard that they were planning a vote to ban polystyrene foam food ware. We were ecstatic at the news since one of our projects involved educating restaurants on the problems of single use disposable plastics. However, certain council members were worried a ban would cause economic strains on small local businesses. We had done our research and knew that alternative products were not cost prohibitive. We attended several city council meetings and spoke to educate the council and voice our support for the ban. At the most recent meeting, they finally approved an ordinance! We had been trying to get them to take action against plastic pollution for quite a time, and they finally did! Without 4-H, I would not have had the opportunity to learn about, educate, advocate and make change for my community. I now know that I can make an impact. Thanks to 4-H I am a valuable resource to my community -- this is what I call the Revolution of Responsibility.
